Financial Aid Process – Applying for Financial Aid

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Required for federal financial aid.
- Must be completed, error-free, for each new academic year
- New FAFSA available October 1st each year
- Review your financial aid information at One.UF

Financial Aid Process – Applying for Financial Aid

FAFSA Instructions

1. Create Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID at **StudentAid.Gov**
2. Apply online: **StudentAid.Gov**
3. Use IRS Data Retrieval Tool
4. UF's school code is **001535**
5. Receive your Student Aid Report (SAR) and check for errors
6. Although you must be accepted for enrollment at UF before you are considered for financial aid, you should apply for aid before being admitted.

Financial Aid Process – Applying for Financial Aid

FAFSA Instructions

- Degree / Certificate: Graduate / Professional
- Current Grade Level: 1st year Grad or Continuing Grad / Prof
- Received 1st Bachelor's Degree: Yes
- Graduate Student: Yes



After completing the FAFSA

After submitting your FAFSA, email the Vet Med Financial Aid Advisor at sfa-help@mail.ufl.edu to request a financial aid package.



Financial Aid Requirements

Who is Eligible to Apply?

To Receive Financial Aid, You must:

1. Be a U. S. citizen, national, or permanent resident alien
2. Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment at least half-time in a degree program.
3. Make satisfactory academic progress toward a degree.
4. Register with the Selective Service Administration, if required to do so.
5. Not be in default on a federal or institutional loan or owe a repayment on a previous financial aid award received at UF or other institution.

Enrollment Requirements

A Graduate student must be enrolled at least half-time in a degree program:

Half-Time

Classification	Fall/Spring	Summer
Graduate	5 credit hours	4 credit hours

Full-Time

Classification	Fall/Spring	Summer
Graduate	9 credit hours	8 credit hours

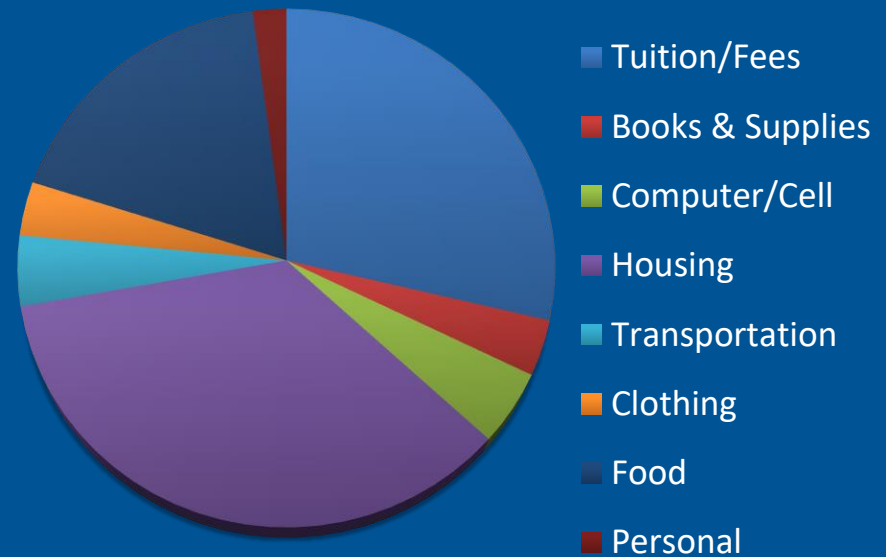
Financial Aid Terms

- Cost of Attendance (COA): Expected expenses for students to live a moderate lifestyle while attending school
- Budget: The Cost of Attendance per semester
- Interest rate: The cost of borrowing
- Origination Fee: The cost to process a loan. The federal servicer subtracts this from the principle loan amount, before the disbursement of a loan
- Awarding/Packaging: Administering financial aid to students

Cost of Attendance – Fall & Spring

Cost of Attendance per term – Fall & Spring (6 credit hours)

• Tuition & Fees	\$ 3,366
• Books & Supplies	\$ 222
• Computer/ Cell Phone	\$ 590
• Housing	\$ 4,515
• Transportation	\$ 560
• Clothing Maintenance	\$ 430
• Personal	\$ 265
• Food	<u>\$ 2,300</u>
• Total Budget	\$ 12,248

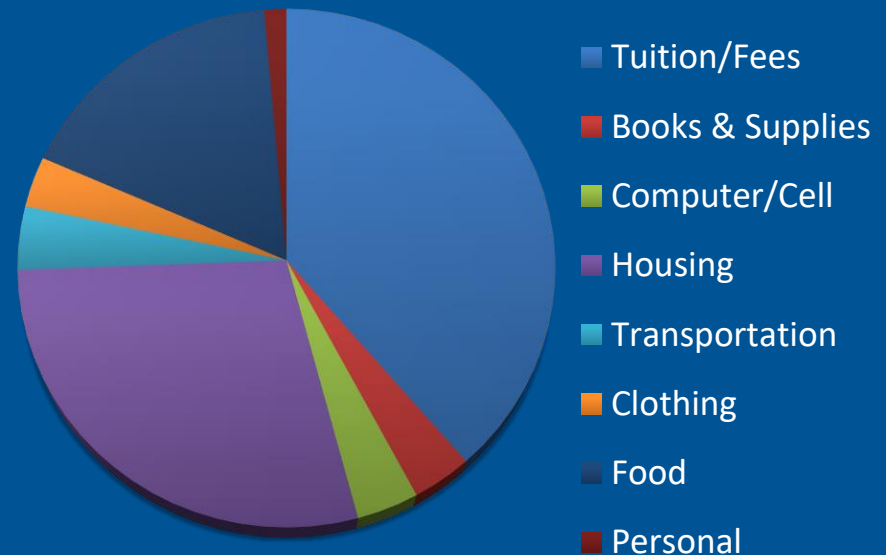

Cost of Attendance - Summer

Cost of Attendance – Summer A & B (6 credit hours)

• Tuition & Fees	\$ 3,366
• Books & Supplies	\$ 222
• Computer/ Cell Phone	\$ 345
• Housing	\$ 2,710
• Transportation	\$ 375
• Clothing Maintenance	\$ 300
• Personal	\$ 130
• Food	\$ 1,620
• Total Budget	\$ 9,068

Financial Aid Programs – Loans & Scholarships

Unsubsidized Loan

- Annual Award amount: \$20,500. School year includes Fall, Spring and Summer terms.

Graduate PLUS (Grad Plus Loan): Additional unsubsidized loan

- Up to your Cost of attendance
- Requires a separate application at studentaid.gov. Applications are approved based upon credit history.

Typical Financial Aid Package

Fall and Spring Budgets: \$24,496

Financial Aid Package:

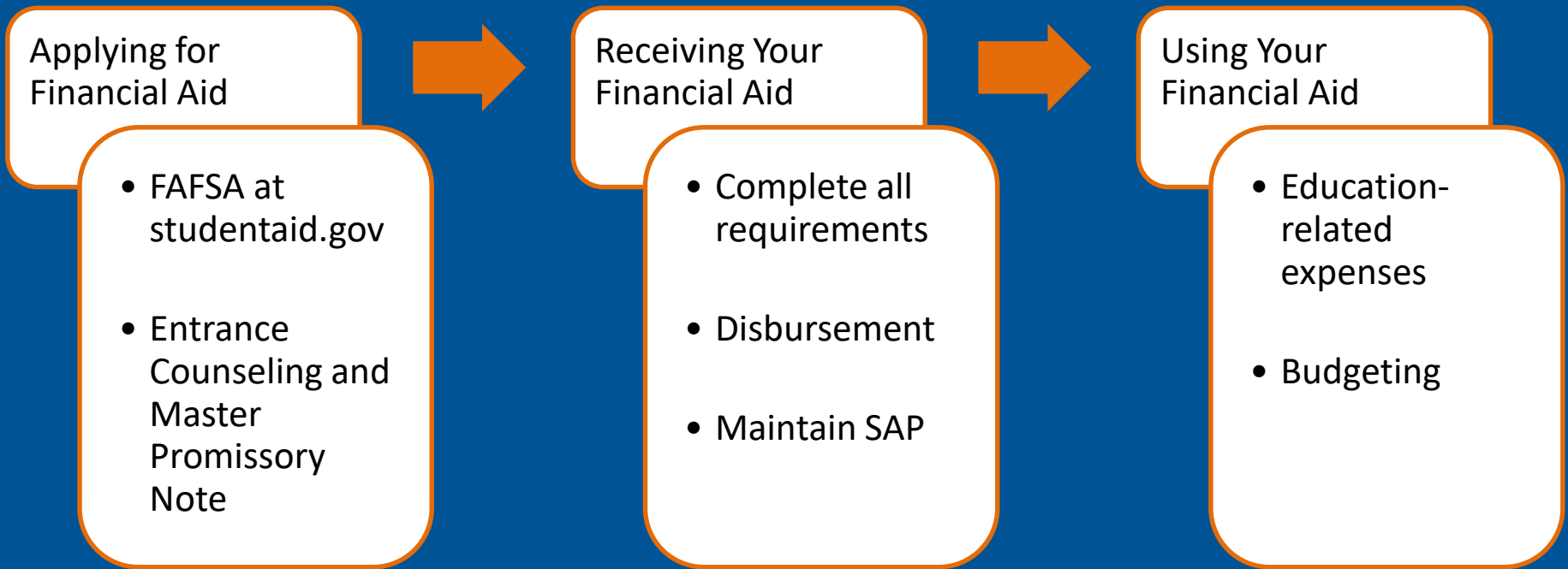
- Annual Limit for Unsubsidized Loan: \$20,500
- Graduate Plus Loan: \$3,996

Summer Budget: \$9,068

Financial Aid Package:

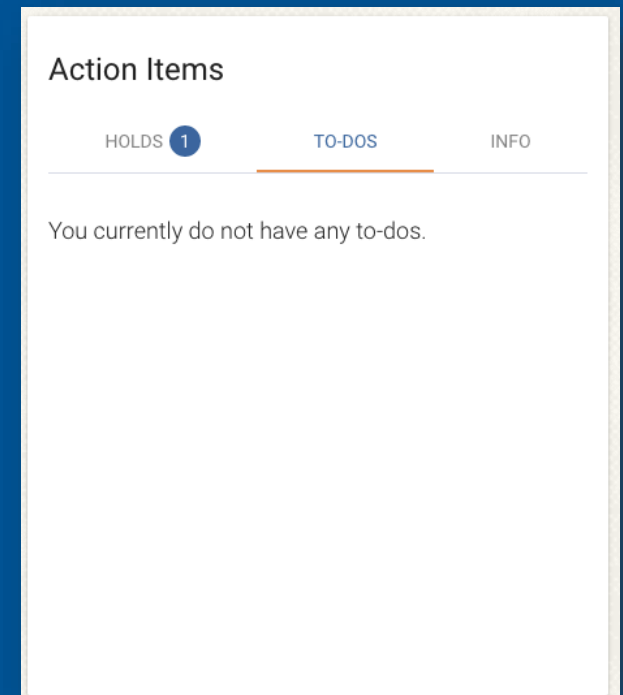
- If annual limit of unsubsidized loan (\$20,500) has been awarded during Fall and Spring terms, student can apply for a summer Graduate Plus Loan
- Graduate Plus Loan: \$9,068

Financial Aid Process – Receiving Your Financial Aid

- Complete all requirements on One.UF.
 - Check your email from SFA.
- Report outside resources before the semester begins.
- Sign up for direct deposit.



Financial Aid Process – Receiving Your Financial Aid

- Disbursement usually occurs after the drop/add period.
- Accepted awards will be disbursed in two parts, split evenly between Fall and Spring terms. There will be one disbursement per term.
- An origination Fee is subtracted from the principal loan before disbursement occurs.
- Disbursement applies towards account balance
 - Remaining balance > student must pay
 - Remaining financial aid > refund
- Sign up for Direct Deposit

After End of Drop/Add

- Scholarships
- Grants
- Loans



Financial Aid Refund

- After all charges have been paid, any remaining financial aid will be disbursed to the student

- Check your One.UF and UF email accounts regularly.
- Make sure your address is correct in MyUFL.
